

ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT PROGRESS AND ENVIRONMENTAL MONITORING UPDATE

As the area around the Springpole site moved out of the mild winter and into spring, the Springpole Environmental Team resumed the water quality monitoring program for the Springpole Project. Key updates from this quarter:

- There were 32 surface water stations in the ongoing program, spanning Birch Lake,
 North Basin of Springpole Lake, Southeast Arm, and 3 regional stations sampled.
- At some sampling locations, we sample multiple depths ("Deep Basin Samples"), which brings the total number of samples collected up to 54.
- The geochemistry monitoring program consisted of sampling 12 field leach bins at site.
- There were 15 groundwater wells sampled in the ongoing program.
- Information regarding the transmission line alternative route update was distributed to the Indigenous communities, government reviewers and stakeholders (see Bulletin #9 on our website at: firstmininggold.com).

First Mining Gold will be continuing consultation with local Indigenous communities and stakeholders throughout the coordinated provincial-federal environmental assessment process and aims to submit the final EIS/EA in the fall of 2024.

FIRST MINING GOLD PROVIDES DONATION FOLLOWING NURSING STATION FIRE

On March 2, 2024, Cat Lake First Nation lost the Central access point of Health Care Services to a devasting fire.



The Nishnawbe Aski Police Services were called to the Margaret Gray Nursing Station

after calls of a structural fire. The First Nation community of Cat Lake once again showed its resiliency and began planning for a temporary Health Care Access Centre. First Mining Gold worked with Cat Lake representatives to address immediate needs and provided relief in the form of medical supplies and over the counter medication as requested by the Health Task Force Team. It was a great honour for First Mining Gold to support the community after a significant infrastructure loss.

MINING MATTERS TRAINING INITIATIVE


NORTHWESTERN ONTARIO MÉTIS COMMUNITY CARIBOU WORKSHOP

On May 2, the Springpole Project Team, including FMG and their technical consultant WSP, discussed the caribou habitat offsetting measures associated with the Project with the Northwestern Ontario Metis Community (NWOMC). The purpose of the meeting was to present information on the measures proposed in the draft Caribou Habitat Offsetting and Compensation Plan, and to discuss new potential offsetting measures. Participants from the NWOMC were invited to share knowledge, comments, concerns and feedback on the presentation, and caribou compensation measures related to the Project.

MISHKEEGOGMANG FIRST NATION CARIBOU WORKSHOP

On June 26, FMG, along with their technical consultant WSP, visited the community of Mishkeegogamang First Nation to present information on caribou and their habitat, including discussion of baseline data collection and potential offsetting options.
